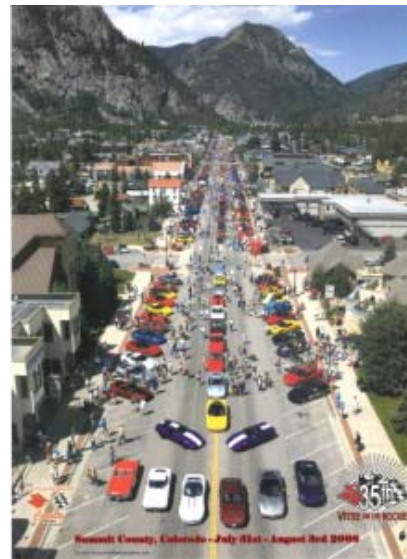
Wednesday we spent the day wandering the shops in Breckenridge and exploring the fine restaurants.
